Primary PE Enrichment	£1200	Funds used to continue to promote physical and PSHE skills within key stages 1 and 2 through the community based soft play activity centre. Improvement in physical skills, following physical education enrichment. Enhancement of in-school experiences for pupils within IMPACTS classes.
Contribution to salary of second full time PE teacher	£4721.00	All PE lessons delivered by qualified PE teachers to maintain high quality outcomes for pupils. Pupils and parents will continue to be signposted to sporting facilities outside of school to give high achievers the opportunity to extend their skills. Pupils will access the wide range of competitive sports to improve their self-esteem and resilience Lunchtime clubs will continue to provide training opportunities to improve skills which contribute to continued success at competitive levels. Primary Gymnastics Programme	£1000	Pilot programme using an in – house coach to develop the performance skills of gymnastics within key stage 2, leading to a competition. Sustainability Next year this will be continued with outside coaches and entry to the local school games gymnastics competitions
Dance	£500	Outside coaches employed to further develop the

		breadth of the curriculum. Developing an area of pupils' physical development and PSHCE that has not been highlighted so far. Sustainability CPD for staff will enable dance to become embedded within the curriculum eliminating the need for an external coach.
Hydro	£4000	Equipment to be purchased to increase the sensory value of the pool for all. Sustainability Core team of staff trained to use the equipment can cascade the training to other staff to ensure continued use of equipment to enhance pupil experience.
Play Equip Primary	£1000	Use of staff's existing expertise to increase the play equipment during "play times" to build on PSHCE skills and development, to also increase the variety of activities. Sustainability Increase in staff expertise will be cascaded to new less experienced staff to maintain momentum.
Resources	£2500	Additional gymnastic equipment purchased to allow pupils to further explore creative activities in a structured environment, leading to an increased awareness of their abilities. Increased progress made compared to last year as each group had access to the resources every lesson Sustainability Once purchased the equipment will continue to broaden pupil experiences and skill level.
