Foxes

During this term the children have been extremely busy in all their subjects. We have been looking at seasons and trees looking at the different types of seasons and how they affect the environment. All children have enjoyed making leaves out of clay by creating a print to go on the clay of their chosen leaf. They then painted these before they went in the kiln. These will be displayed within the school sometime in September. They also had fun making clay pots, which they can use as a fruit bowl, or for a decorative plate. The children had so much fun doing these!



In Maths, they have been looking at Statistics this term, they have focused on Tally Charts, Picture Graphs and Bar graphs. To find out certain information like what is our favourite chocolate? We had to taste test all the chocolates before we asked our friends what they liked the most! We found out what is our favourite fruit, cakes and animals. Oh, not forgetting ice cream on these very hot days.



Sunflowers

This summer Sunflower class has enjoyed our PE sessions. We have been able to use the bikes. Some of us learnt to ride the three-wheeler bikes and some of enjoyed having a ride in the specially adapted bikes. The PE teacher told us to wear helmets to keep our heads safe and to have the belt fastened if the bike seat had one. It was great fun!





Kingfishers

This term in Kingfishers, we have been learning all about plants and water. In Science, we have been investigating parts of plants, and we have planted our own beans and helped them to grow. We explored different types of seeds and how these can become different plants, and we experimented with some cress seeds.

We celebrated History Day. We learnt all about the Fire of London. We made houses and we stuck on flames to represent the Great Fire of London.





Ducklings

This term we have been looking at the topic 'the seaside'. We have loved exploring water and sand. We have mark made in sand, rescued sea animals from water and created our own mini beach!

We have been looking at filling and emptying in maths and have used our new learnt capacity skills to empty our cups of water over our teacher! We have all been working really hard on our skills learnt over the past year. We have been practicing forming all of the sounds correctly in our name, increasing our attention and focus levels and all joining the group input and doing what ducklings do best....getting messy!

This year Ducklings class has been a joy to teach, I am so proud of how far they have all come and can't wait to see them all around school in September!











Ducklings and Fawns trip to Wildwood

This term Ducklings and Fawns went on a school trip to Wildwood. This is the first time they have left the school and they made us all so proud! They went on a bear hunt over the bear enclosure, while repeating the words from the story by Michael Rosen! They all sat beautifully and ate their lunch while watching some squirrels! The children were amazing the whole day and were an absolute credit to Meadowfield and did the school proud! We are so proud of our reception children!













Snowdrops

This term the Snowdrops have enjoyed learning all about *Animal Habitats*. In English, the Snowdrops worked incredibly hard to plan and then write their own versions of *The Gruffalo*. We had fun reading our stories to an audience.

In Science, the Snowdrops categorised animals into different groups and learnt lots of new vocabulary such as predator, prey, mammal and reptile.

The Snowdrops especially loved our trip to Wildwood. Although we were tired from all the walking, the Snowdrops explored every area of the wildlife park, went over the Bear Bridge and saw so many fantastic animals, including bison, snakes and wolves!











Kestrels

This term in Kestrels class we have been finding out where food comes from. We have found out about healthy and unhealthy foods and how food affects our bodies and helps us to grow. We named all of the different body parts and thought about what we might need to do to keep our bodies healthy. Kestrels class have grown cress seeds, sunflowers and planted marigolds. The children have made healthy sandwiches and pizzas and then sequenced these activities to remind ourselves the steps needed to prepare food. We thought about paying for food items at the shops, made shopping lists and practised waiting our turn in the queue.

The children loved having their parents in to visit for the parent open afternoon and are now thinking about transitions to new classes for September. It has been a fantastically successful term for Kestrels class who are looking forward to a nice rest over the summer after all of their hard work this year.





Ladybirds

This term we have been learning about the 'Seaside' and have focused on developing our vocabulary. We have explored stories linked to the sea and really enjoyed the story Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch, where we made our own zip wire (for the basket of food) and also tried mustard in our ham sandwiches!

Our role play has been a café and ice cream parlour, which supported communication through acting out. We have some great waiters and cooks! This also embedded the concept of money and to understand the value of different coins, as well as working out prices and giving change.

We have been very proud to participate in the sponsored activities, such as rowing, cycling and dance; which has given us opportunities to try new challenges.





Poppies

This term in Poppies class we having been learning about the Seaside and our story has been 'Sharing a Shell'. The class have enjoyed engaging with different activities such as making sea turtles from plastic bottles and making clay shells. We have had some great descriptive sentences describing the characters using adjectives to say what they would do at the beach.

In maths we have been learning about position and direction and have used our bodies to show where we are (on top, next to, behind etc.) using classroom objects such as the table and chair. We have also learnt about direction and have learnt how to move forwards, backwards, left and right and had lots of fun dancing to the song the Cha Cha Slide to support this.

Robins

This term has been a busy term for the Robins, from visiting Forest School to designing our own clay sea creatures; they have all been busy bees.

Robins have been looking at The Natural World, in particular beside the sea. In English, we have been looking at a book called *Flood* and tried to imagine how we would feel if our house had been flooded. In Maths we have continued to look at statistics and number and how these can help us to read the world around us. Clay modelling has been the focus of our Art sessions and in Science we have conducted multiple investigations into the life cycle of plants, animals and insects.

Forest School days continue to be the most popular day, even the adults want to be like the children and get involved! Robins have enjoyed an excellent term; their progress has continued to impress us.

Then later in the term, we visited Fenn Bell Zoo, we were very lucky because we had the whole zoo to ourselves and were given the opportunity to explore independently. We watched the meerkats, and the flamingos and chatted to the parakeets.

In class, we came back and explored the life cycles of some of the animals we saw. As we near the end of term we have been enjoying extra sports sessions including Pop Dance and enjoying water play as the weather got hotter.
