3 (2)	Sensorimotor Play	The child uses all their senses to explore items. They look at, touch, smell, lick and shake things.
	Organising Play	The child has not yet worked out the purpose of items but does begin to group and line them up.
	Functional Play	The child has discovered the purpose of items and begins to use them in accordance with their basic function.
	Pretend Play	Functional Imaginative The child starts to use resources functionally, often representing real life experiences, for example, talking on the phone, feeding the baby.
		Representational The child uses one object to represent another, for example a banana is used as a telephone, a bowl is used as a cup.
		Symbolic The child applies real life experiences and qualities to their play for example giving the baby doll a name and creating scenarios such as: the baby is ill and needs medicine/ is going to the doctors, they car is dirty and is going to the car wash/ has broken down.
